Adopting the Etraffic Press publishing model for grades 4-12 in Math, Social Studies, Language Arts, and Science would constitute 68% of the above annual tonnage. The Etraffic Press Green Strategy will ensure that high quality resources are in place in the classroom with a significant reduction in school carbon footprints.
